On Thursday 24th September 2009 at St. Augustine's cathedral, priests in the Catholic Diocese of Auki were honored to commemorate World Priest Day.

THE CLERGY MET IN AUKI

From Monday 21st to Thursday 24th September 2009, priests in the Catholic Diocese of Auki gathered in Auki for their final meeting for this year.

The meeting which took place at Fanualama conference room was attended by Bishop Chris Cardone op, Bishop of Auki, fourteen priests and a deacon. Three priests were unable to join the gathering as they were away on overseas missions.



According to Fr. Peter Kevin, secretary of the meeting, the four day meeting was a fruitful one which ended successfully with a number of resolutions agreed upon and passed. "One major outcome", said Fr. Kevin "was the appointment of two priests to be posted to the Diocese of Gizo, in the coming year. They are FRS Boniface Liliu, who is currently assistant parish priest at Rohinari parish, and Gabriel Matotewa, parish priest of Usu'usue parish in Northeast Malaita.

The two priests who had been serving in Western and Choiseul provinces in the Diocese of Gizo will be rejoining their own Diocese of Auki in 2010. They are fathers Albert Kalu and Jeffrey Puritau of Dala and Rohinari parishes respectively.

Other priests' postings for 2010 were also announced at the meeting.
